MINUTES OF THE USS OZBOURN ASSOCIATION MEETING SEATTLE, WASHINGTON SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 15, 2007

1600 Meeting was called to order by Association President Rudy Boff
President Rudy Boff led the Pledge of Allegiance followed by the invocation.

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT — Rick Johnson, Corresponding Secretary & Fireball Editor
Called for continuing input for Fireball newsletter
Asked everyone to submit their "onboard" nicknames to be published in a future Fireball newsletter

TREASURER'S REPORT — Warren Zschach, Treasurer and Historian

Income since the 2005 reunion until 2007 reunion was \$9,468.76

Vice-President Ken Keene reported on strategies for recruiting new members. He suggested that instead of a recruiting committee, each Association member to act as a recruiter and try to find new shipmates that have never joined nor inquired about the association.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Fredericksburg Plaque Committee — Paul Logan
Paul reported the Ozbourn plaque was installed at the Fredericksburg, Texas Navy Memorial on Veterans' Day, 2006. The plaque contains a photo of the USS Ozbourn as it appeared in April, 1946. Shipmate Joe and Billie Davis attended the dedication ceremony and took pictures of the plaque on the memorial wall. (Please see photo story on page 3.)

Reunion Committee Report — Warren Zschach, Treasurer and Historian
Overall, the reunion planning and operation went smoothly with only a few minor concerns as follows:

Be wary of working with an "Event Planner" instead of working with Armed Forces Reunion personnel directly. It is believed that better service will be provided working directly with AFR.

The \$500 allotted at the 2005 reunion for the reunion committee to use in investigating potential sites was not used. Paul Logan suggested that this money is well spent and should be used by the 2009 reunion committee. He made a motion to use the unspent \$500 earmarked for the 2007 reunion committee should be used by the 2009 reunion committee. The motion was passed. Paul also recommended the new reunion committee obtain a copy of a book he shared, which is a reunion-planning publication.

Mobile, Alabama was suggested as a possible 2009 reunion site.

There was some discussion whether or not our Association has adequate liability insurance during these reunions. The reunion committee will investigate this issue.

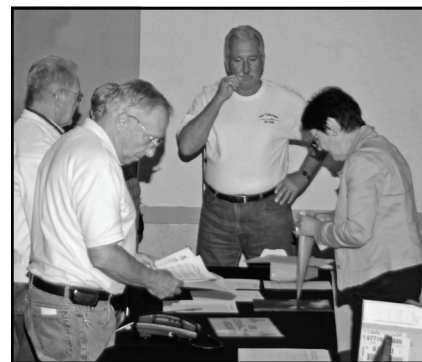

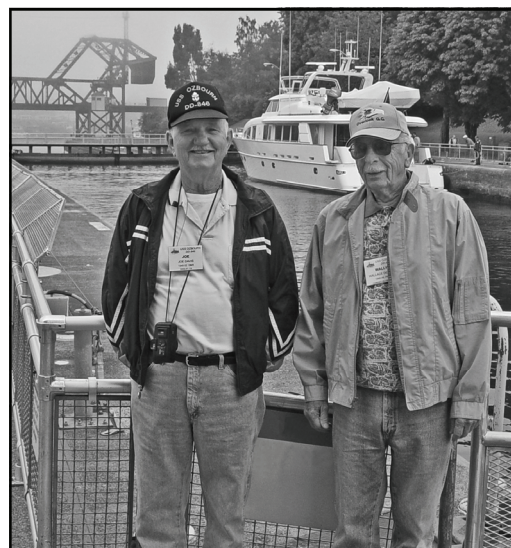

The only way to get there was through the Government Locks. As you can see from behind us, this was a tight fit for the Oz. The crew manned the rails from Bremerton until the ship moored in downtown Renton.

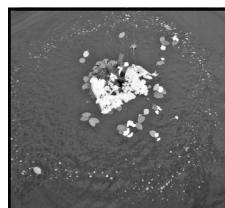

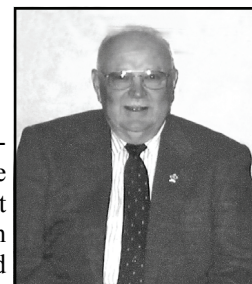
Michael Owen was born on June 8, 1940 in Kalamazoo, Michigan. After graduating from Ann Arbor High School, Owen enlisted in the U.S. Navy. He honorably served his country between 1963 and 1969 as a fire control technician second class aboard the Ozbourn. He was a Vietnam War veteran.

HERMAN SCHWAB

WW II Veteran, USMC

Herman Schwab served in the Marine Corps during WW II. He was the youngest of the group of Marines that served with Joseph Ozbourn on Tinian Island when young Ozbourn was killed in action. Schwab turned 18 during the battle on Tinian.

Schwab was in four major battles during WW II. He was wounded on Saipan and Iwo Jima. He also served during the Korean War. Schwab was a guest during the 2003 reunion along with Eddie Newman, Tex Freeman and Delbert Fliar, the three other Marines serving with Joseph Ozbourn on Tinian.

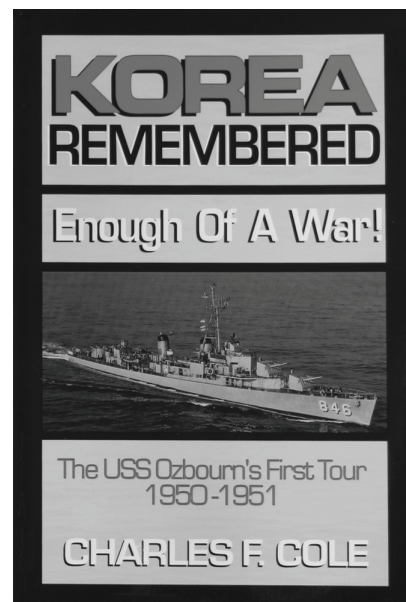

The book *Korea Remembered: Enough of a War!*, the USS Ozbourn's First Tour, 1950-1951, is a first-hand account by shipmate Charles F. Cole, as the war "sandwiched between WW II and the War in Vietnam."

Cole's historic account was first published in 1995, just in time for the dedication of the Korean War Memorial, which is in site of the Vietnam Wall in Washington, D.C.



While the book mainly focuses on Cole's life aboard the Ozbourn during the Korean War, it also includes some of the time he spent as a UDT team member and his Navy Reserve years. The book is no longer in print through Yucca Tree Press.

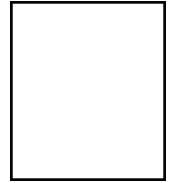
