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Editor's Remarks

As your self-appointed editor I herewith launch the first issue of *Fireball*! Lest any of our shipmates wonder about the origin of the name, it was the voice call sign in the Korean War era. I am certainly open to suggestions for another name and solicit your advice. In fact I hereby solicit them!

My own service extended from September 26, 1950, when I reported aboard via high-line in the Yellow Sea, to July 24, 1952. We will make every effort to keep hotel costs at a reasonable level. As for transportation costs, all senior citizens (62 or over) should take advantage of the discount air fares available on most airlines. They do not advertise these rates -- you must ask for them.

I estimate that we will need about 50 shipmates (plus wives or lady friends) to commit to a reunion. So, if you have any additional contacts with former crew members or CO's, let me know. I am in direct or indirect contact with two CO's, Charlie Akers and Bill Fargo. I would like to get more involved. Commodores from the period when OZBOURN was a division flagship are welcome too.
