




Again thank you so much. And thanks from my family. Four months ago I became a Great Grandfather.

Minutes of the 12th Biennial Reunion Meeting

26 September, 2015 — Baton Rouge, LA

At 7:15 AM, 26 September 2015, the business meeting of the USS Ozbourn DD-846 Association was called to order by President Guy Posey with 35 shipmates in attendance. All in attendance joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to our Flag.

The minutes of the 2013 Business Meeting in San Diego were read by Recording Secretary Ken Keene. With no additions or corrections, motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes as read; vote to approve passed by the majority.

The Treasurers Report was given by Treasurer, Phil Roberts. A summary of costs pertaining to the "Fireball", maintenance of the Association web site and membership in American Military Reunion Foundation was given. With outstanding bills related to the reunion an estimated balance of the treasury is approximately \$19,000.00. Motion was made and seconded to approve the Treasurers Report as read; vote to approve passed by the majority.

In the absence of the Corresponding Secretary, President Guy Posey gave a report on the costs of publishing and mailing the "Fireball" newsletter. Motion was made and seconded to approve the Corresponding Secretary Report as read; vote to approve passed by the majority.

Rudy Boff, the Ships Store Operator reported that due to the lack of sales of the CD of the Memorial Service in San Diego and the books Authored and donated by Charles Cole, the price would be lowered in order to clear the inventory.

The Reunion Report was given by the Reunion Committee Char Guy Posey. The preliminary finances were \$16,301.00 collected from 70 registered guests. Expenditures were broken down to what each tour cost as well as the Banquet and Hospitality Room. There were some refunds made to shipmates who had to cancel. The final balance will not be known until after the reunion and the final bills are totaled. Guy believes the reunion will finish in the Black with an approximate \$2,500.00 profit. Motion was made and seconded to approve the Reunion Report as read; vote to approve was passed by the majority.

Old Business:

By-Law Changes:

The Changes to the Association By-Laws that were voted on at the San Diego Reunion in 2013 pertaining to donations of the Association monies, Dissolution of the Association and Ships Store were read. With no further discussion, motion was made and seconded to approve the new Association By-Laws; vote to approve passed by the majority.

New Business:

Election of Officers:

With none of the current slate of officers expressing a desire to resign, a call for volunteers and nominations for each office was made. The only volunteer was Mark Beaulieu for the Office of Vice President. A vote was taken with Randy Humphries, incumbent Vice President receiving the majority of the votes Motion was made and seconded to accept the slate of current officers, President Guy Posey, Vice President Randy Humphries, Recording Secretary Ken Keene and Corresponding Secretary Jeff Parker. Vote to approve the slate of officers passed by the majority. (Continued on Page-5)

New Business (Continued):

Donations:

In keeping with the new regulation in the By-Laws, it was reported that three requests for donations were received and approved by the Association Officers for recommendation for a vote by the membership. Recommendations were: \$500.00 to Tin Can Sailors Thomas J. Pelton Destroyer Museum Grant Program; \$250.00 to the Wounded Warrior Project and \$250.00 to Disabled American Veterans. A brief summary of the use of the Associations donation to each organization was given by Secretary Ken Keene. Motion was made and seconded to approve the donations. Vote to approve passed by the majority.

Next Reunion:

President Guy Posey pointed out that in keeping with Section 7, Paragraph 2 of the Association By-Laws, the 2017 Reunion should be held in the eastern part of the country. A request for volunteers to serve on the 2017 Reunion Committee was made. Mike Ward, Harold McKeehan and Mark Beaulieu volunteered with Mark Beaulieu being appointed Chairman.

A discussion of the Association Policy to make available to the Reunion Committee the amount of \$500.00 to cover expenses incurred by committee members while planning the reunion was brought to the floor by President Guy Posey. It was pointed out that the amount is insufficient. A recommendation by the Association Officers to increase the amount to \$1,000.00 with the requirement of receipts for reimbursement was made. Following a brief discussion, a motion was made and seconded to accept the recommended increase in funds available to the Reunion Committee. Vote to approve passed by the majority.


With no further New Business brought to the floor, the 2015 Business Meeting was adjourned at 8:40 AM.
