As all hands are already aware, the Association attempts to vary the sites throughout the U.S. so as not to place a burden on those residing around the entire country. As a result of the 2017 Reunion being held in Norfolk, VA, and the 2015 Reunion being held in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, it was once again time to meet in the Western part of the country. After surveying several possible Host Cities, **Portland, Oregon**, the last homeport of the "OZ", was ultimately selected.

Clearly, our reunions are a family event and the Association Officers are very grateful for family members that attend and escort those shipmates who may require a little assistance. We are also very pleased with the number of shipmates who are able to attend the reunions.

Our Host Hotel for the 2019 Reunion is the **Sheraton Portland Airport Hotel**, 8235 Northeast Airport Way, Portland Oregon. The Reunion Committee worked very hard and has negotiated an excellent daily rate of \$119.00 plus tax, double occupancy, that also includes a daily breakfast for two. The hotel has also agreed to offer the same rate for three days prior and three days after the reunion for those wishing to arrive early or stay a little longer, based on availability. 48 Cruisers **203 Submarines 98,000 Bombers** 93,000 Tanks 3,000,000 Machine Guns





UNREP MISHAP, NSFO EVERYWHERE

While serving on the "OZ", Trifon P. Tripsas, IC3, (56-57), recalled a great number of good days and a few of the bad days. One such bad day occurred during underway exercises involving several ships that included the USS Princeton off of the coast of San Diego. The exercises included an Under Way Replenishment (UNREP), where the Ozbourn was refueling from the carrier USS Princeton CVS37. Even though the seas were rough, we managed to pass and connect the refueling line and commenced the pumping oil. While doing so, a submarine was detected. We commenced to break away; however, the refueling line was still connected. The line stretched and broke, spewing oil down the side of the Princeton and the deck. The refueling hose was dragged underneath the "OZ" and fouled the rudder, causing a loss in steering which resulted in a near collision with the Princeton. This required the "OZ" to stop dead in the water allowing the submarine to do its duty. After several hours, the divers were able to clear the rudder.

The joke that weekend was "If you go to town, don't say you are from the Ozbourn as there may be sailors from the Princeton nearby." That is how mad the Princeton crew was that were required to clean up the oil from the side of there ship.


