

"WHERE ARE YOU GOING?"

The events in this article are from my personal diary recounting events from the USS Ozbourn's 1962 West Pac cruise.

OCTOBER 1962

We left port at 0800 on October 11. The Ozbourn was conducting operations with the local Formosa Chinese Navy in ships once owned by the U.S. Navy. What a mess! Not only were there language and cultural barriers between the two navies, the Chinese lacked basic seamanship skills.

During one of the maneuvers, which were supposed to be conducted in close synchronization, the Chinese destroyer headed straight for the Ozbourn. I told the CIC (Combat Information Center) officer of the watch, that by my calculations, the Chinese ship was on a collision course with us. The information was relayed to the bridge.

The captain of the Ozbourn radioed the captain of the Chinese man-o-war of the pending collision. Unable to understand either English or the ability to cipher the Allies Code Book on ships' maneuvering, the Chinese kept coming toward us, closing the gap at an alarming rate. Repeated radio and signal flag messages to the Chinese vessel regarding the perilous course upon which the foreign ship had taken, failed to convince the Sino sailor to alter his ship's course. In a state of sheer panic, the Ozbourn's skipper ordered an immediate hard to starboard and full speed ahead in an effort to avoid a certain catastrophe. In a voice that was both bewildered and embarrassed, the Chinese commanding officer wondered where we were going. He pleaded for us to return to the operating area, even as we headed over the horizon line.

It's a Part of Who You Are

After meeting with scores of Destroyer Veterans over the past few years, it's striking to witness how deeply, and how similarly, their service at sea influenced them. These are the kinds of comments you hear repeatedly:

"I had the best years of my life aboard that ship..."; "I'm still good friends with many of my old shipmates..."; "Being at sea on that destroyer really grew me up..."

You smile at the pure pleasure and satisfaction in their faces as they sit around the table, coffee in hand, and share sea stories: "Did you ever pull liberty in Yokosuka?"; "Could you believe how she'd roll in a beam sea?"; "One night I was standing Starboard lookout while we were at plane guard off Gibraltar and..."

Since the ancient Greeks, throughout history sailors have enjoyed a special status among all people because so few humans have ever known or understood the mysteries -- the frights and the pleasures -- of going to sea. That's why, even today, those who wear Navy (and Coast Guard) Blue are unique among our armed forces.

And there's even another hierarchy, another unspoken level of respect, among Navy salts, too. You see, it's one thing to sail aboard a "heavy" -- a carrier or an amphib. It's quite another to take serious weather while standing watch on the lurching deck of a destroyer, and every USN sailor who ever watched a destroyer shoulder her way through the big water knows this is true.

Every man and woman who's been to sea on one of these ships, who's stood the watches, and held the lives of their shipmates in their hands, who've completed their tough daily duties despite fatigue and stress and danger and discomfort, holds their kindred DesVets in the highest esteem.

You observe this almost magical mutual respect at every meeting and convention of our organization, and you sense it in every member letter and comment in our magazine. How can this be so?


