Greetings to All Shipmates, Families and Friends




During these trying times for our Great Country, I truly hope that you are all doing well and staying healthy.


I would also like to wish you all a very Happy Holiday Season and to remind you all that the Ship Store managed by Rudy Boff is open for holiday purchases.

USS OZBOURN COMMANDING OFFICERS

********CORRECTION*******

Heard from Jerry R. Woods, CDR (Ret), who pointed out a typo in CDR N.D. Nelson's name.

I served aboard the Ozbourn from 1963 to 1967, first two years mostly as Communications Officer D.W. Berger and M.D. Nelson, and the last two years as Staff Ops for COMDESDIV 92, Captain Ardwin Frach. As I recall, CDR. Nelson's first name was Marvin so listing in the Fireball should be M.D. Nelson Jr. and not "N.D". LCDR Nelson, who was Executive Officer of Ozbourn at the time, succeeded CDR. Berger as CO of Ozbourn at sea during Ozbourn's July 1964 transit to WESTPAC from Long Beach. CDR. Berger suffered a serious back injury during the transit and was high lined at sea to a passing MSTS ship for treatment and further transfer to a Naval Hospital. We never saw him again. LCDR. Nelson became one of the youngest, if not the youngest, CO of a WESTPAC Destroyer.

Consequently, Ozbourn rendered honors to almost every passing Navy ship except maybe minesweepers. Nelson was soon promoted to Commander and completed the WESTPAC tour on Ozbourn. (*The Commanders First Initial has now been changed to M. Thank You Jerry for the correction.*)



open house held for yard workers

The Seventh Fleet destroyer USS Ozbourn (DD-846) recently held an open house for the workers of the Yokosuka Ship Repair Facility and their families to give them a first hand look at the finished product of a six-week maintenance period.

The Japanese workers and their families were invited to tour the ship as a goodwill gesture.

Over 120 guests toured the ship with guides selected from the crew. Interpreters from the Ship Repair Facility were used to bridge the language barrier.

Although the Japanese employees are on U. S. Navy ships a great deal of the time, they seldom have an opportunity to see the entire ship when it is ready for sea. The open house also provided an opportunity for the families of the workers to see where their husbands and fathers work.

OZBOURN HOSTS FAMILY CRUISE

"All lines on deck"

With one prolonged blast from the ship's whistle, friends and families of the destroyer USS Ozbourn (DD-846) were underway for a day at sea.

Over 120 dependents, friends and special guests were on board for the cruise in Tokyo Bay. The visitors were invited to spend a day at sea following the ship's six-week maintenance period in Yokosuka, Japan.

During the morning the guests toured the ship and were introduced to the jobs the sailors perform. At the end of the tour all guests joined the mess line for a ration of Navy food.

In the afternoon ship's equipment, such as gun mounts and torpedo tubes, was explained and their operation demonstrated for the guests.

Throughout the day guests strolled on the main deck taking in the salt air and sunshine. Many were at sea for the first time and enjoyed the sensation of speeding through the water at 25 knots as the Ozbourn completed calibration tests.

When the ship's commanding officer, John G. Denham, eased the ship into her berth at Yokosuka the guests all agreed that keeping a "ready" destroyer ready is a big job and an important one.


