bourn DD846 Association.







# **UPDATE to 2018 "FIREBALL" STORY**

While en route to the 2017 Reunion, Shipmate Mike Machalleck and his lovely Wife Katha, toured the US Naval Academy. What a surprise when their tour guide directed the group's attention to the Ensign from the USS Ozbourn DD-846, hanging in Bancroft Hall, the mid shipman's dormitory.





Many of you will remember the above story from the 2018 Winter Edition of the "Fireball" Newsletter depicting the attached photographs of Shipmate Mike Machallek and his Wife Katha taking a tour overseen by Naval Academy Tour Guide James Minderlein. At that time and as the photograph of the plaque identifying the Stars & Stripes flown on the Ozbourn depicts, that Private Joseph Ozbourn's name is misspelled.

It is with great pleasure that the USS Ozbourn Association has been contacted by Naval Academy Tour Guide James Minderlein who advised that the plaque has been corrected and installed adjacent to the flag flown by the Ozbourn during operations in the Korean War. The flag had been donated to the academy by Captain Charles Akers. *(Editors Note: The Association is very grateful to James Minderlein for his tenacity in ensuring the plaque was corrected.)*

# Ensign of USS Ozbourn (DD-846)

The Navy commissioned destroyer Ozbourn in March 1946. In 1949 and 1950 midshipmen trained aboard the ship. With the North Korean assault on the south beginning in June 1950, Ozbourn joined Task Force 77 operating off the Korean coast. The destroyer participated in the amphibious landings at Inchon and flew this ensign during that operation.

Ozbourn withstood enemy fire in both the Korean War (1950-1953) and the war in Vietnam (1955-1975) before being retired from service in June 1975.

The ship was named for PVT Joseph William Ozbourn, USMC, who was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor for sacrificing his own life by falling on a Japanese grenade to save his comrades during the battle for Tinian Island, 30 July 1944.

# FIVE-O at SIX-O

(Writer's Note: The below article is from the personal ships log of Rick Johnson. This was my first WestPac cruise aboard the Ozbourn. The headline <u>Five-0</u> refers to Hawaii being the 50th State to join the Union. The <u>Six-0</u> in the headline refers to sixty years since that WestPac cruise. My retirement flag was flown above the USS Arizona Memorial on January 1, 1991.)

At 0923 hours on June 7, 1962, the Ozbourn departed Pier 16 at the Long Beach Naval Station for Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. The weather on that day was cloudy and humid. The Ozbourn was part of the mightiest armada of U.S. ships to leave the West Coast for the Far East since WWII. The lead Flag Ships of the 15 ship convoy included the USS Hornet (CV 12) and the USS Topeka (CLG 8).

As the ships prepared to enter historic Pearl Harbor, Hawaii on June 13th, all hands were ondeck on the port side in service dress whites to render honors to the recently dedicated USS Arizona Memorial (May 30, 1962). The Ozbourn was one of the first U.S. Navy ships to render honors to the soul stirring, stark white memorial, dedicated to the 1,177 men who died during the Japanese attack on December 7, 1941.

With the shrill of the boatswain's pipe over the 1MC, the order was given: **Attention on deck to port**, **Hand Salute**, **Two!** With 15 ships entering Pearl Harbor that day, the solemn salute was repeated each time a Navy Man-O-War passed by the sunken battleship.

Ironically, Marine Private Joseph Ozbourn is buried at the National Cemetery of the Pacific not far from the USS Arizona Memorial.


