# MAIL CALL

The following letters and emails were received by your Association Officers during the last quarter.

### **DECEASED SHIPMATE'S FAMILY SEEKING HELP**

We have received an email from Denise Groll, Sister-in-Law of Shipmate Robert A. Carlson, SN, (67-68), requesting assistance to re-open a VA DIC Claim on behalf of Carlson's widow. According to Denise, Carlson, also known as "Bugsy" or "Bob", joined the ship in Yokosuka Japan. While attached to the Ozbourn, Carlson served in Vietnam where the ship conducted Sea Dragon and Yankee Station operations around December 1967 -June 1968. Since Carlson passed away in August 1992 in his 30's, after suffering from several illnesses, believed to be related to his military service. Since then, Denise has encouraged her Sister to re-open a denied claim after the Blue Water Navy presumption and service connection for hypertension. According received multiple Air-gun injections, and a tattoo, that required medical treatment. Carlson was treated in Subic Bay at one time; however, those records were unavailable, possibly destroyed in an earthquake. Carlson was also treated on the ship for injuries sustained when the Ozbourn received direct hits from an enemy shore battery.

The Carlson Family is requesting any information related to Shipmate Carlson's injuries and subsequent treatment both on the ship and in Subic Bay to contact them.

(Editors Note: As your Editor, I have reached out to the Carlson Family for permission to utilize their email address so fellow shipmates with any information that would assist them with their VA Claim could reach out to them. To date, I have yet to receive that authorization. Therefore, if any shipmate believes they have information, please contact me, Jeff Parker at email: Ljparker1@cox.net.
