As you know, you may start making reservations at the Double Tree Hotel in Columbus, Georgia for our upcoming 2023 Reunion.





I was aboard the "OZ" when we collided with the USS Hornet, while refueling off San Diego in the Fall of 1960. We had lost the load on the port screw and were pushed into the starboard side of the Hornet. I was down in Sonar sitting with my back to the port side bulkhead when we collided and the bulkhead just bent in and then out behind my back. I was pretty scared at the time.

When the Ozbourn visited Brisbane, Australia, they returned the tremendous welcome given by the "Diggers".

Once was when they entertained visitors to the ship with afternoon concerts of swing and country music on the fantail.

Les Andrews, General manager 4KQ Radio heard of them and invited the three to appear on the nationwide hour long "South Coast Calling" program.

Fireman Gaylon Jacobs, Gunners Mate 3rd Class Jay Farlow and Seaman Lyle Harnden did six numbers on the program and were such a success that the audience refused to leave when the program ended, so they sang and played for another 35-minutes on tape for a broadcast to the ship at sea later. While steaming for Guadalcanal they were able to tune in to the farewell transmission. (Editors Note: I unfortunately was unable to identify the source of the aforementioned press release and photo published by an unknown agency in Australia.)

FARLOW REVISITS AUSTRALIAN PERFORMANCE 58 YEARS AGO

When 82-year-old Jay Farlow wished his wife of 56 years happy anniversary on the radio, he wasn't speaking on a local station. He was on 4KQ Radio in Brisbane, Australia, a station he and his band had wowed a live audience 58 years ago.

The call transported Farlow back to the time when he was serving as a Gunners Mate on the USS Ozbourn in Japanese waters.

In the afternoon, he and his band, "The High Seas", entertained visitors with swing and country music on the ship's fantail.

The 4KQ Radio General Manager in Brisbane heard about the band and invited the three sailors to perform live on an hourlong program called "South Coast Calling".

After hearing the group perform six numbers on the program, the audience refused to leave, so Farlow and band members Gayton Jacobs and Lyle Harnden sang and performed Elvis Presley hits and country songs for another 35 minutes. The day the group left Brisbane, the radio station recorded another 20 minutes on tape for broadcast to U.S. ships at sea later.

All Navy Magazine picked up the story and it went all over the world, according to Farlow.

Fifty-eight years later, close to his wedding anniversary, Farlow was looking through a log book and came across the photos and the original press release from the performance. He decided to write the station and send copies of those items to it. He even found the station on the Internet and listened to its broadcast.

On March 22, two of the station's DJs interviewed him live on the radio, speaking with him, his wife, Charlotte, and grandson, Lance. The DJs were thrilled to talk with Farlow and tell his story of that performance so long ago. (Editors Note: The aforementioned article, written by Karen Murphy, appeared in the Thomasville, Georgia Times Enterprise on March 30, 2016.)
